Cheque in memory of brother presented to RNLI Kirkwall.

Local coupled raises over £5600 through worldwide bridge competition to boost RNLI funds at Kirkwall Lifeboat.

Local couple Anna Gudge and Mark Newton organised a bridge competition that attracted 1498 pairs from 98 clubs in 6 countries including the UK, Kenya and Sweden. Entrants were asked for a donation to enter and a great total of £5659.45 was raised.

Mark's brother, Geof, who had always been interest in boats had died unexpectedly last year. Mark and Anna decided to raise money for a charity in his memory and thought their interest in playing bridge might be a way to do this. It proved to be correct and they were delighted with the total raised.

They presented their cheque at Kirkwall Lifeboat station on Tuesday 10th July.

The RNLI charity saves lives at sea. Its volunteers provide a 24-hour search and rescue service around the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland coasts. The RNLI operates over 230 lifeboat stations in the UK and Ireland and has more than 100 lifeguard units on beaches around the UK.
