Right to Determine Rectification</p> <p data-bbox="1128 485 2011 596">The Director alone has the right to <b>determine rectifications</b> when applicable. Players do not have the right to <b>determine</b> (or waive - <b>see Law 81C5</b>) <b>rectifications</b> on their own initiative.</p> <p data-bbox="1128 620 2047 649">B. Cancellation of Enforcement or Waiver of Rectification</p> <p data-bbox="1128 675 2040 754">The Director may allow or cancel any <b>enforcement</b> or waiver of <b>a rectification</b> made by the players without his instructions.</p> <p data-bbox="1128 778 1581 807">C. 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| <p>Law 11A - The right to penalise an irregularity may be forfeited if either member of the non-offending side takes any action before summoning the Director. The Director so rules when the non-offending side may have gained through subsequent action taken by an opponent in ignorance of the penalty.</p> <p>Law 11C - Even after the right to penalise has been forfeited under this Law, the Director may assess a procedural penalty (see Law 90).</p> | <p>LAW 11 - FORFEITURE OF THE RIGHT TO RECTIFICATION</p> <p>A. Action by Non-Offending Side</p> <p>The right to rectification of an irregularity may be forfeited if either member of the non-offending side takes any action before summoning the Director. The Director does so rule, for example, when the non-offending side may have gained through subsequent action taken by an opponent in ignorance of the relevant provisions of the law.</p> <p>B. Penalty after Forfeiture of the Right to Rectification</p> <p>Even after the right to rectification has been forfeited under this Law, the Director may assess a procedural penalty (see Law 90).</p> |
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
